The meeting was called to order at [6:03:12 PM](#).

Chairperson Adams asked that, since there are many items to cover during the meeting, Members keep their comments brief and specific and that all discussion is directed by her as the Chairperson.

**E. AGENDA APPROVAL, ADDITIONS AND/OR DELETIONS**

Secretary Gonzales moved to approve the agenda, Committee Member Steinhauer seconded; all were in favor, motion carried.

**F. CONSENT CALENDAR**

1. SUBJECT: Minutes for February 2<sup>nd</sup> and March 1, 2016 meetings

Committee Member Miser moved to approve the minutes of February 2, 2016 as presented, Committee Member Simpson seconded; all in favor, motion carried.

Committee Member Steinhauer moved to correct the minutes of March 1, 2016 under item G-6 Fire Department Update by changing the word “experienced” to “training” in the first paragraph. Secretary Gonzales seconded; all in favor, motion carried.

**G. DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

1. SUBJECT: Measure S Budget, Revenue, and Expenditure Report – February 2016

City Manager Chapa presented the Revenue & Expenditure Report for February 2016.

2. SUBJECT: Measure S Gang Prevention/Intervention Grant Applications [6:10:35 PM](#)

Police Chief Silver Rodriguez presented the staff report related to the Measure S Gang Prevention/Intervention Grant applications.

Public comment:

Colin Smallman indicated that he headed a committee of about 25 to 30 volunteers that established Measure S. He expressed his concern about expanding Measure S to grant funds to community based organizations because it is beyond the realm of the public safety measure and he does not see how it fits with the description of the ballot measure.

Randall Guerra asked if the Community Resident Services differs from Sherry's Ark and what was allocated from Measure S for the grant funding.

Grant Presentations:

Representatives of Big Brothers-Big Sisters (Unity Estates) presented their grant request for a high-school "Bigs" program. This is a new program, requested by Mr. Church of the alternative high school, in which high school students will mentor elementary students.

Arlene Mendoza & Rudy Matcham of the Boys & Girls Club – Project Purple presented their grant request to assist in the ongoing conflict of the "reds" and the "blues" street gangs. The purpose of the Boys & Girls Club – Project Purple, in partnership with Family Worship Center, is gang prevention and to show gang members that there is a better way of life. Utilizing the Phoenix program, Boys & Girls Club – Project Purple teach resistance and conflict resolution skills and encourage community service.

Arlene Mendoza and Kim Ozuna of the Boys & Girls Club – Street SMART presented their grant request. SMART (skills, mastery, and resistance training) is a national evidenced based prevention program to address risky behavior of youth. The SMART program helps deter gang involvement and promote healthy attitudes in youth.

Ali Valencia, Director of Community Resident Services, stated she was confused that her program was not included in the recommendations. She indicated that after reading the other grant applications she discovered claims about her program that she did not agree with and that were not brought to her attention. She indicated that the Boys & Girls Club – Project Purple 16/17 program plan was not discussed with her and is in conflict with the current programming in place at Unity Estates. She further indicated that as of today, no other program will take place at Unity Estates apartment complex. The current collaboration and partnership with Big Brothers-Big Sisters will continue at Unity Estates because it is a program she help developed. She announced that she is terminating her relationship with Boys & Girls Club and requested that the Measure S Committee be more diligent in

reviewing proposals to make sure that applicants are truthful about what they are doing in the community of Sanger and not misrepresenting other organizations.

Dr. Jerry Valadez, of SAM Academy, indicated that SAM Academy is in year 3 of existence in Sanger. He stated that he is able to respond to specific questions about their financial status and can show how Measure S funding is being expended. SAM Academy is a youth development program unique in the Central Valley with a focus on science, art and music. The purpose of their grant request is to provide quality after school programs for at-risk children in Sanger and to promote skills and values that are important for school and career success.

Randall Guerra, Executive Director of Sherry's Ark, indicated that Sherry's Ark is an organization 4 years in the making to establish permanent residences for veterans.

Secretary Gonzales indicated that he is in support of the recommendations of the internal review committee and that grantees should understand the evaluation program being implemented.

Committee Member Steinhauer asked if other Committee Members had any questions that arose from what was presented that should be discussed.

Committee Member Miser indicated that the City Council would be responsible for approving the grants and the Committee's responsibility is to give approval to the Council that the grantees meet the guidelines and requirements. He further indicated that the information included in the applications do not allow the Committee to make such recommendations. Member Miser suggested that the item be tabled until a process can be put in place to safely make the recommendations.

City Manager Chapa indicated that there are two issues to potentially resolve. First, is the issue presented by Member Miser in terms of financial information and the requirement to submit audits. Though the process itself does not require an extensive forensic audit, all the organizations have expressed that they have an internal process and have offered to provide additional financial information as needed. Secondly is the issue presented by the representative of Unity Estates in that Unity Estates would not participate in the Boys & Girls Club – Project Purple program. Taking that into consideration, the Boys & Girls Club – Project Purple would then have three locations instead of 4 and the Committee might consider reducing the amount that was to be allocated by one quarter.

After further discussion, Committee Member Simpson moved to approve the recommendation of the Internal Review Committee to grant funds from Measure S to provide funding support to Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Central CA, Boys & Girls Club – Project Purple, Boys & Girls Club – Street SMART, and SAM Academy. The amounts to be funded were amended to decrease the amount proposed for the Boys & Girls Club – Project Purple by 20% and that the 20% would be distributed to the other groups at the Council's discretion.

The amounts to be funded are as follows:

Big Brothers/Big Sisters	\$12,000
Boys & Girls Club- Project Purple	\$24,198 (\$30,247 less 20%)
Boys & Girls Club- Street SMART	\$27,520
SAM Academy	\$54,720

Police Chief Silver Rodriguez reported the following: the Police Department is partnering with several groups to hold a RAGE (raging against gangs everywhere) Conference at the Family Resource Center on April 16<sup>th</sup> from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.; Sanger High is sponsoring a Career Fair on April 18<sup>th</sup> and has invited the Police Department to participate to encourage high school students to seek law enforcement careers; appointed a new police officer, JD Torrence and working closely with the Human Resources Department to fill the other vacant positions; Coffee with the Chiefs will be held on April 6<sup>th</sup> from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. at the Unity Estates Community Room.

***H. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION***

Dr. Jerry Valadez thanked the Committee for their consideration regarding the grant funding and suggested that the Committee consider looking at the residual that is still in the budget and not being used this year to be distributed to the qualified applicants.

City Manager Chapa reminded the Committee that at the April 7<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting, the firm hired to conduct the Measure S polling will be presenting the initial poll findings.

***J. MATTERS INITIATED BY COMMITTEE MEMBERS***

Committee Member Simpson thanked the grant applicants for contributing to the community to prevent youth from getting into gangs.

Vice Chairperson Steinhauer indicated that he has been on the Committee the longest of all other Members and that along the way the staff has explained to the Committee that Measure S is comprised of five facets including gang and drug prevention and intervention.

Chairperson Adams thanked the groups for the work that they do – have been a grantwriter and run small non-profits, know tremendous amount of work goes into writing grants; thank you; wish we had so much more money to have allotted to all. Don't give up, keep it up.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

In 2014, the Police Department implemented the use of video surveillance cameras at three sites in the community, with the goal of improving safety and reducing the incidence of crime. Crime statistics and call activity data confirm those areas have declined in need for public safety services. The Police Department is seeking to expand the video surveillance camera project at four additional sites (all parks) with the goal of improving safety in the selected areas.

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## **BACKGROUND:**

During the first month of full operation, the Sanger Police Department was able to witness through the CCTV camera a subject committing vandalism to the Sanger skate park. A patrol unit was quickly dispatched and an Officer apprehended the surprised perpetrator. The recorded video imagery of the crime was later used as evidence in the case. Currently, there has been a decrease of crimes in Sanger Park, downtown area, and the Sanger skate park. The goal is to grow the Sanger Police Department's CCTV system to offer greater coverage areas in the City of Sanger while utilizing the same evidentiary imaging quality to capture crimes in progress, provide clear suspect and vehicle identification to investigators, and maintain valuable storage images for later investigative recall.

The Sanger Police Department is requesting Pelco products to again be purchased through its sole source vendor- Teledata. Teledata was the original vendor who installed the Pelco CCTV systems at Sanger Park, downtown area, and the Sanger skate park. The Sanger Police Department will utilize \$10,000 of BSCC fund monies towards this project.

The addition of CCTV camera systems at JFK Park, Faller Park, Cesar Chavez Park, and Jenny Park; would further expand Sanger City park safety by reducing or eliminating criminal assaults, thefts, drug sales or use, vandalisms, and other violent crimes. Parks should be readily available and enjoyed by all the residents and visitors to Sanger.

The addition of more Pelco CCTV cameras will continue to offer the Sanger Police Department a "force multiplier," viewing resource with the ability to surveil the JFK Park, Faller Park, Cesar Chavez Park, and Jenny Park, which can be monitored from the Sanger Police Department by on-duty staff or volunteers.

Implementation of the Pelco CCTV system will provide for crime prevention or deterrence at the four locations, allowing Police Officers to respond in a timely fashion if an in progress crime is occurring. Due to the high imaging clarity of the cameras, Officers and Detectives will be assisted in their related investigations. Cameras at those locations can "see," citizens requiring medical assistance, view lost children, monitor civil disturbances or gatherings, and allow for the adequate and efficient police resource deployment to safely resolve them.

## **REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:**

By maintaining our relationship with the same vendor, who had originally designed and installed the current CCTV system, additional locations would be easily and seamlessly integrated. The four parks would have the same evidentiary quality camera surveillance system that would stand the rigors of the local environment at the varying locations in the City of Sanger, coupled with a viable interoperable means of transmitting wireless signals to a secure viewing and storage area. Pelco surveillance cameras are an industry standard with worldwide applications in both the commercial and military markets. Pelco, which is a subsidiary of Schneider Electronics, is locally based in the City of Clovis. The actual cost exceeds the approved allocation by \$86, 470.36 therefore a budget amendment request to increase the allocation is necessary.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The purchase price of this system and related accessories is \$96,470.36. If approved, the funds used to procure this will come from the Measure "S" Fund, minus \$10,000 coming from a State fund (BSCC).

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The Police Facility is an essential services building and strives to be secure in all respects for safety and security of police personnel, police equipment and pertinent information systems. At present, surveillance cameras allow for monitoring of the police facility, however they are aging and some have become inoperable. The timely and proper monitoring of the detention area (jail) and police interview room is of crucial importance and necessity. Additionally, monitoring the interior and exterior of the police facility is critical to the effective protection of the essential services provided by the Police Department. The goal is to improve security at this site with high quality surveillance cameras.

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## **BACKGROUND:**

Criminal investigations are complex, comprehensive and in depth endeavors, requiring Detectives and Officers to ensure they are gathering and memorializing all the necessary statements and visual images to achieve a successful prosecution. An interview room that has both high quality video and audio capabilities will greatly assist those Detectives and Officers during that interview process.

The booking and jail facility is a very precarious location for officers. Prior to entering, officers have to relinquish and store their weapons. Upon entering the jail booking area, Officers must closely interact with suspects who are unrestrained during the "live scanning," and photographing process. During this booking process, violent suspects have physically assaulted Sanger Police Officers. Individuals, who have been temporarily jailed while awaiting transport to the Fresno County Jail, have attempted to take their life by hanging or by other personal suicidal means. It is sad to mention that several years ago a prisoner while in the custody of the Sanger Police Department did take his own life in the main jail cell. By having prisoners under constant high imagery surveillance, future tragedies may be avoided.

The Sanger Police Facility was built in 1974 and constitutes an essential services building. In view of this classification, the building is a secure facility and we strive to monitor the exterior and surrounding area. The Police Department has a "drop box" for narcotics and syringes in front of the building, drying and evidence buildings to the west of the facility, and parking lots full of city and patrol vehicles; which are all accessible to pedestrian traffic from 7th street and Jensen Ave. There are additional areas of safety concern, where a police officer or city employee could be assaulted during low light conditions or evening hours. A comprehensive CCTV system will afford more security in and around the main police building and the surrounding structures.

The Sanger Police Department is requesting Pelco cameras and associated products to be purchased through Teledata, which holds a sole source vendor status with Pelco. Teledata was the original vendor who installed the Pelco CCTV systems at the Sanger Park, downtown area, and the Sanger skate park. The purchase of the Pelco CCTV system has been identified in the FY 2015 -16 budget and allocation of \$51,000 has been included as an approved expenditure for FY 2015-16.

The Pelco CCTV system will vastly improve the quality of criminal interviews by Detectives and Officers to provide first-rate visual evidentiary imagery and audio recording. The memorializing of deceptive behavioral language or admittance statements that are necessary for successful prosecution and future jury review. It will also enhance officer and public safety within the interior and exterior of the building. Those unattended prisoners in the jail facility, who are awaiting transport, will be watched and heard via the CCTV system. The sensitive structures and receptacles surrounding the main building will always be under surveillance. The southern and northern parking lots will both be under surveillance to constantly observe police and city vehicles.

The Sanger Police Department building is publicly accessible with minimized security. Although citizens are escorted through the building, they are not required to be screened for weapons or subject to search prior to their entrance. At any time, Sanger Police Personnel are at various states of unguarded attention, while performing their duties; a CCTV system will offer a heightened sense of security with overlapping visual coverage of all the entrance /exit areas, especially on such sensitive areas as the front desk, armory, property/evidence room, and the entrance to the jail.

## **REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:**

It is beneficial to maintain the same vendor who installed and is intimately familiar with the Department's

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current Pelco CCTV system. Due to the high quality and durability of Pelco products, we recommend the continuation and addition of Pelco cameras and associated products. Pelco currently supplies CCTV systems to the Fresno Police Department and the Clovis Police Department. Pelco surveillance cameras are an industry standard with worldwide applications in both the commercial and military markets. Pelco, which is a subsidiary of Schneider Electronics, is locally based in the City of Clovis. The actual cost exceeds the approved allocation by \$56,744.23 therefore a budget amendment request to increase the allocation is necessary.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The purchase price of this system and related accessories is \$107,744.23. If approved, the funds used to implement this project will come from the Measure "S" Fund.
