

CEREMONIAL MATTERS:

City Clerk, Barbar Mergan, conducted swearing in of new Commissioner, Ed Cuadros. Pinuelas welcomed Cuadros aboard. Cuadros then had introductory comments.

Staff member, Fitzgerald, handled the re-organization of the Commission. Nominations for Chairperson were taken: Steinhauer nominated Cuadros. Motion approved 5-0. Cuadros resumed control of the meeting. The Commission thanked Pinuelas for his leadership.

Cuadros accepted nominations for Vice Chair: Reese. Motion approved 5-0.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Katrina Steinhauer had comments regarding a service learning project through the Sanger Environmental

Fund at the "65 Acres" park area.

Gail Sergent had comments on the project.

CONSENT CALENDAR:

Motioned by Commissioner Steinhauer and seconded by Commissioner Villarreal to approve the minutes of the February 28, 2011. Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting. Motion approved 5-0.

DEPARTMENT REPORT:

H-1: SUBJECT: Parks and Recreation Department Report:

<u>Fitzgerald</u>: 1) Provided updates on the current and future Parks and Recreation activities (i.e. Kiwanis Youth Basketball, Girls Softball, Blossom Trail Run, Start Smart Baseball, Health & Wellness Fair, SYC Open House, facility rentals – indoors & out, etc.).

<u>Commissioners:</u> 1) Nielson wanted clarification on SYC Open House and the Health & Wellness Fair. 2) Villarreal had questions regarding participation numbers for Girls Softball.

H-2: Kings River Conservancy - grant for river access facility project at 65 Acre Park area:

Mulligan: 1) Presented information from Staff Report: boat access, info kiosk, gates, iron ranger, restrooms, picnic tables, operations & maintenance, parking, etc.)

<u>Public Comments:</u> 1) Gail Sergent asked about previous grants & projects by KRC. Asked for clarification for the term "boat launch", specific location for proposal, etc. 2) Karen Steinhauer concerned about how decisions now will impact use & development in the future, etc.

<u>Commissioners:</u> Concerned about increased traffic, engineering for culvert, parking issues, etc. Asked for more information and the group to present at a future meeting. Suggested that a conceptual plan or master plan be developed for this area. Asked that the commission - and those interested from the community - to tour the 65 Acre Park prior to the next meeting.

H-3: Kings River Nature Area – purpose, intended/appropriate usage, etc.

Mulligan: 1) Presented information from Staff Report: school trips, study/research projects, Boys & Girls Club, SUSD, etc.) Asked for feedback as to how we formalize the process to effectively & efficiently handle requests for various intended uses of that area.

<u>Public Comments:</u> 1) Tammy Tucker provided history of Boys & Girls involvement in that area: river clean-ups, camping, stewardship, "leave no trace", science, energy efficiency, water conservation, etc. 2) Karen Steinhauer commented about more signage needed, asked for confirmation of property boundaries, etc. Concerned about damage in and around the area. 3) Gail Sergent commented about gate on west side of area, concerned about possible liability to the City if/when guests – invited or otherwise – are on the property.

Commissioners: 1) Discussed the need for a conceptual or a master plan. 2) Need additional signage, define more control of the area; install a gate on the west side, etc. 3) Asked for a list of users - past, present, and future - to get more feedback and input in the process. 4) Concerned about unknown users accessing, using, and potentially damaging the area. 5) Concerned about construction in/around the bridge and would like more research to be done on that project.

H-4: Stewardship Grant Application: Tammy Tucker.

Mulligan: 1) Introduced Tammy Tucker from the Boys & Girls Club to discuss a grant opportunity.

<u>Tammy Tucker:</u> 1) Goal of this specific grant is to get underserved youth in the outdoors, among other things. The catalyst grant is for \$15,000. An example would be to create monthly trips such as camping, caving, snowshoeing, river clean-ups, etc.

<u>Commissioners:</u> 1) Asked if grant could be used for swimming programs, farms/agricultural areas, etc. 2) Asked about timeline/expiration of grant, if awarded. 3) The general consensus was in favor of the grant and to pursue it.

<u>Public Comments:</u> 1) Karen Steinhauer asked that no activities be conducted in/around the nature study area, however.

H-5: Brehler Square Volunteer Project: Cory Heizenrader.

Mulligan: 1) Presented information from Staff Report: a former volunteer through an Eagle Scout project would like to make improvements to the Brehler Square area; such as gazebo, murals, benches, a steel arch, stage area, etc).

Commissioners: 1) Requested a sketch of a potential layout (i.e. site plan) identifying these possible additions, changes, etc. 2) Concerns about removing trees. 3) Asked that the large scope of the project proposed to be broken down to smaller tasks/projects on a timeline. 5) Asked if this area would then become a reservable/rentable space (i.e. for picnics, weddings, and other ceremonies, etc.) 4) Commented about status of the "adopt a park" program.

H-6: Parks & Recreation "Priority List" continuation.

Fitzgerald: 1) Asked for more direction.

<u>Commissioners:</u> 1) Requested that item #4 would be edited to include development of a master plan to the 65 Acre Park area. 2) Asked about the possibility of creating a "foundation" for the purposes of pursuing additional grants, etc. 3) Add "policy of use" to some of the items. 4) Asked that this list and other updates from this Commission to be presented to Council soon.

H-7: Volunteer Community Center/Senior Center clean-up project.

<u>Mulligan:</u> 1) Presented information from Staff Report: another volunteer group - with significant skilled labor (i.e. general contractors, former City Planner, etc) - has offered to complete a number of tasks/projects in/around the Community Center & Senior Centers.) <u>Commissioners:</u> 1) Generally, very much in favor of the offer. 2) Asked about liability to the City. 3) Concerned about pruning trees; stucco deterioration, etc.

H-8: Parks & Recreation fee schedule and facility reservation review.

<u>Fitzgerald:</u> Presented information from Staff Report: asking for discussion to provide direction for fees to various recreation programs, activities, events, etc. Commissioners: Tabled to next meeting for more discussion.

H-9: Parks & Recreation Commission to consider meeting date change.

<u>Fitzgerald:</u> 1) Presented information from Staff Report: asking for direction to potentially change the meeting day.

Commissioners: Tabled to next meeting for more discussion.

<u>Public Comments:</u> Karen Steinhauer asked for clarification to Katrina Steinhauer's request to map the nature area for her class project.

BACKGROUND

The City has 65 acres located adjacent to the Kings River. The land has been designated in the City of Sanger's General Plan as Parks and Open Space, more specifically, a regional park. The Parks and Recreation Commission have included this area on the Project Priority List.

The San Joaquin River Conservancy has approached the City with a proposed River Access Facility to be tentatively located on the north area of the property adjacent to the river. They propose to build a paved parking lot, install picnic tables, build an informational kiosk, a fishing station, and a pit toilette. The project will also include operation and maintenance of the area including the cleaning of the toilettes.

The group has already built like facilities along the Kings River with great success. In 2007 they obtained 2 grants and built the Thorburn Access Park at the crossing of the SR180 and the river crossing. In 2010, the Conservancy was awarded \$285,000 to develop the North Riverside Park just downstream of Pine Flat Dam. The group currently has approximately \$175,000 that will be available in July 2011 to fund this proposed Sanger project.

The presentation will be performed by representatives from the Kings River Conservancy.

The following is a listing of projects that have been chosen by the Parks and Recreation Commission as possible recommendations to the City Council for future consideration:

- 1) Development of a large Regional Park located in the City that can be used for different functions and accommodate a large amount of people.
 - a. Additional playing fields with lights; and policy of use.
 - i. Soccer, Baseball, Softball, Football, Tennis, Etc
 - b. Develop and expand the Veterans Park plan; and policy of use.
 - i. The City should continue to work with Veterans groups to assure that a viable Veterans Park is constructed.
 - c. Construct a new Community Center and Pool; and policy of use.
 - i. A new Community Center should be constructed, possibly near a new regional park to accommodate the growing population.
- 2) Development of a Master Plan for the 65 Acre Park area adjacent to the Kings River.
 - This area should be a park that is reflective of the natural setting of the river, not an active park.
 - \circ Activities such as fishing, camping, horseback riding, educational opportunities.
- 3) Updating current parks with additional features like PAR Courses and Tot Lots.
 - Existing parks should be updated and upgraded. Each park should be kept to the best standards. Additions such as PAR courses and tot lots should be installed.
- 4) Finish the skate park; and policy of use.
 - o The Skate Park should be completed. Landscaping, lighting, signs, security.
- 5) Development of fairgrounds in the City; and policy of use.
 - The City would benefit from a large area designated as fairgrounds to handle large formal events & fairs. This could be located more along the outskirts of town.
- Bike trails to connect to other cities and establish bike trails.
 - Construction of bike trails to interconnect other local communities.
 - o Helps to promote healthy living.
 - County is also looking into connecting cities with paths.
- Construct a new Senior Center; and policy of use.
 - A new senior center should be constructed near a new community Center to accommodate growth.


BACKGROUND
